Pudelwohl – healthy and gay in Dortmund

At the Pudelwohl health center, gay and bisexual, cisgender and transgender men receive counseling on issues related to relationships, safer sex, STIs, coming out, and sexuality. Free HIV tests and STI screenings are also offered.
